British Summer Time will probably run from 1st April to 28th October, but these dates are subject to change by draft order under the Summer Time Act of 1947 and had not been confirmed at the time of going to press. All times in this diary are therefore expressed in Greenwich Mean Time; for BST add one hour to GMT.

Eclipses

There will be two eclipses of the sun in 1962, a total eclipse on 4th-5th February and an annular eclipse on 31st July. Neither will be visible from Great Britain.

HANDY INTEREST RULES

To find how much any given rate per cent is in the pound, divide the rate per cent by 5 and consider the result as shillings and a fraction of a shilling. Thus 30% is 6s. in the pound.

To find the simple interest on a sum of money at 5 per cent per annum, take the pounds as shillings and a fraction of a pound as the same fraction of a shilling. Thus, interest at this rate on £65 10s. = 65½ sh. = £3 5s. 6d.
