Dr Montessori having "sfternoon tea "with Miss Adelia Pyle from New York . Miss Pyle was the first American to take a Course under Dr Montessori in . She was also one of the first of a long line of people who first became converts to Montessoriism - and later converts to Catholicism .

Dr Montessori and Miss Pyle became close friends, and for some fifteen years Miss Pyle was the Dottoressa's constant companion companion. She often undertook the difficult task of acting as interpreter in Dr Montessori's International Courses, a work requiring the combination of many qualities.

Eventually Miss Pyle went to live at San Hiovanni Rotondo, where she built an orpahange and worked under direction of Padre Pio, the Stigmatis. Montescori also knew Padre Pio, went to confession to him when she visited San Giovanni Rotondo and was much impressed by his sanctity.
