TO OUR EMPLOYEES:

As a Nursing Home employee you have high standards to maintain and are expected to set an example of neatness and cleanliness, to refrain from gossiping or loud talking and any other activity that would be disturbing to the patients. Your job requires efficiency tempered with kindness and friendliness. An efficient blending of these three will help you accomplish more for your patients and achieve satisfaction and pleasure for yourself.

The Nursing Home is a quiet zone and this should be borne in mind from the time you begin work until you leave. Please modulate your voice and give every consideration to our patients.

You are expected to be courteous at all times to the patients, visitors and to your fellow workers. Courtesy and cheerfulness are the measure of a good employee. You must remember that the Nursing Home may be a new experience for the patient and the family and they must be treated with the utmost tact and understanding. Your actions will help determine the attitude of the patient and the family and the acceptibility of the Nursing Home. Questionable conduct of any kind cannot be tolerated in our Nursing Home.

All information concerning patients or Nursing Home business must be held in <u>strict</u> confidence and must not be discussed with others in the Nursing Home not concerned with such information or with individuals outside the Nursing Home. ALL INQUIRIES CONCERNING PATIENTS SHOULD BE REFERRED TO THE OPERATOR OR CHARGE NURSE.

Honesty IS the best policy. It is your responsibility to safeguard the patients property as you would your own. Please be careful in the use of Nursing Home property. Articles found on the Nursing Home premises shall be turned over to the operator or charge nurse.

It is important that you report immediately to the Nursing Home any change in the information given on the application form. (Uniform Records No. 103 -- Wash. State Nursing Home Ass'n.) All employees must have health cards. These may be secured from your local health office. Employment will be terminated without notice for any of the following offenses: Frequent lateness, Insubordination, Intoxication, Theft, Unexcused absence, Soliciting tips or Gifts, Fighting, Serious infractions of Home regulations. Any employee who voluntarily leaves without notice cannot expect his pay until the next regular payday.

Employees are asked to cooperate in helping prevent injury to themselves, other employees, patients and visitors by observing the following:

- 1. Keep posted on the current fire rules of the Home and evacuation procedures.
- 2. Avoid accidents by eliminating hazards.
- 3. Be alert for safety factors in wheel chairs, beds and other equipment.
- 4. Report immediately all accidents to the operator or charge nurse.

Smoking by employees is prohibited except in designated areas.

If you have suggestions to offer relative to any improvements you think would be effective, please offer them to the management.

Of necessity, the Nursing Home is open at all times and you are therefore urged to be alert for the entry of unauthorized persons. If you see anyone who does not work in the Nursing Home, please offer assistance in directing him to his destination.

"Never, as at this moment, has the Christian Faith needed the earnest endeavour of those who profess it. I would ask you who are gathered together in this meeting to consider the great aid that children can give to the defence of our Faith.

Children are sent to us as a rain of souls, as a wealth and a promise that can always be fulfilled; but that needs our efforts to help in bringing about that fulfilment. Do not consider the child as a weakling; for it is he who builds the human personality, and whether this personality is going to be Christian or not depends on his environment and on us who are the guides of his religious formation.

Do not consider that because the young child cannot understand in the way that we do that it is useless to make him partake in our religious life. It is among the simple people whose women take their children to church while they are still breast-fed that the staunchest faith is to be found. The child-unconscious drinks in divine powers, whilst the reasoning consciousness of the adult is but human.

It is by you who enjoy the great boon of belonging to the Catholic Faith that the responsibility for the future generations should be more intensely felt; for among you are those who have renounced the world to bring the world to God. Take then as aid in your task, in all humility and faith, the "all-powerful children" (Benedict XV); take upon yourselves the task of seeing to it that their limpid light be not dimmed; and protect in their development those natural energies implanted in them by the guiding hand of God.

May God be with you at this meeting and may He guide your conclusions and your decisions."
