In recognition of "the many and noteworthy achievements of James Aloysius Farley in the fields of industry, government and religion . . .

. . . His rise from the New York State Legislature to the Chairmanship of the New York State Democratic Committee, to the positions of Postmaster General and Chairman of the National Democratic Committee . . .

. . . Most important of all, in religion, he has distinguished himself as an outstanding example of a Catholic layman in critical times and in political spheres where the profession of his faith entailed great personal sacrifices . . ."

HUBBARD THOMAS BUCKNER, M.D.

" . . . enjoys a national reputation for his development and application of techniques in osteoplastic surgery. He is a member of the American College of Surgeons, The International College of Surgeons, The American Association of Surgery of Trauma, The American Medical Association, The Northern Pacific Surgeons Association and the Association of Seattle Surgeons.

Through his efforts Seattle University became sponsor of the Medical Unit, 50th General Hospital, in World War II. Under his direction the 50th won battle credits for participation in the Northern France and Normandy Campaigns and was awarded the Meritorius Service Unit Plaque for superior performance of duty."

BACCALAUREATE HONORS

Based on the four-year scholastic record of the graduate, baccalaureate honors require the earning of at least 90 quarter hours as a Junior and Senior at Seattle University, the securing of at least the grade B in the comprehensive written examination, and the attainment of a high grade point average in the four-year curriculum of studies. A candidate who has made an average of 3.25 graduates Cum Laude; one who has made an average of 3.5, Magna Cum Laude; one who has made an average of 3.75, Summa Cum Laude. An A grade carries four grade points, a B 3 grade points, a C 2 grade points, a D 1 grade point, and an E no grade points.
