MR. THOMAS J. BANNAN

In the compounding complexities of our highly industrial age, the ever-increasing need for enlightened and wholesome leadership must be fulfilled, else man may become a victim of the instruments of his own invention.

Our international ascendancy finds us with many brilliant and accomplished feats of established leadership to material success. But the number of lay leaders who, mindful of man's spiritual and material needs, devote their energies to the betterment of both are pitifully few.

Thomas J. Bannan, eldest of ten children, exemplifies by his own record the spirit of Christian leadership, designed to keep man free of his own bonds. Recognizing the essentiality of responsible beings, he has striven always to preserve those values that emanate from man's God-given dignity.

His rise to the status of executive leadership in the councils of industry, government, civic life, and education, testifies to his outstanding personal ability to assume the sacred trust of social responsibility.

As business executive, he is again a Director of the National Association of Manufacturers, after having served as a national vice-president for three years. As President of Western Gear Works and Hallidie Machinery Company, he has provided constructive guidance to their successful development. As a public servant, he served on the National Advisory Commissions of the Office of Price Administration, and the War Production Board, during World War II.

As Chairman of its Board of Lay Regents, he has been a source of inspiration to his fellow regents, and the administrative officers of the University. The innumerable ways in which Mr. Bannan has taken a personal interest in Seattle University can never be fully appreciated or adequately repaid.

For these singular achievements, his unselfish service, and, pre-eminently, for his exemplary character as a Catholic gentleman, Seattle University is proud to confer upon Thomas J. Bannan the seal of its highest award—the degree of Doctor of Laws, *Honoris Causa*.

Baccalaureate Honors

Based on the four-year scholastic record of the graduate, Baccalaureate Honors require the earning of at least 90 quarter hours as a Junior and Senior at Seattle University, the securing of at least the grade B in the comprehensive written examination in Philosophy and Theology, and the attainment of a high grade point average in the four-year curriculum of studies. A candidate who has made an average of 3.25 graduates Cum Laude; one who has made an average of 3.5, Magna Cum Laude; one who has made an average of 3.75, Summa Cum Laude. An A grade carries four grade points, a B 3 grade points, a C 2 grade points, a D 1 grade point, and an E no grade points.

THE HONORABLE THOMAS E. MURRAY

Few other persons exemplify so well as does Thomas E. Murray the versatility of present day leaders in industrial labor and governmental administration.

A graduate in Mechanical Engineering of the Sheffield Scientific School at Yale University, he entered directly into the field of management, becoming President of the Metropolitan Engineering Company of New York.

As President of that company and of the subsequently founded Murray Manufacturing Company, Mr. Murray contributed no less than two hundred patented inventions to the industrial world. For directing the production of many strategic materials during the late world war, Mr. Murray was the recipient of a special citation from the War Department. This citation was merited for his ingenious contribution which accounted for twenty-five percent of the total manufacture of mortar shells in the war effort.

His insight into the perplexities that beset the economic phase of our lives enabled him to be among the first to reconcile the problems of labor and industry. In 1941, he served the public interest in the successful termination of labor controversies including those in the aircraft and public-transportation fields. His tactful approach and equitable solution to many administrative issues have brought to him the respect and admiration of American Business interests.

The particular appointment by his country which, more than any other, has brought Mr. Murray to the attention of the public, is that of Commissioner of the Atomic Energy Commission. This acknowledgment of his ability has placed him in a position of trust in which his decisions may well affect the lives of all Americans.

For his distinguished service to his country and his Church, no less than seven Catholic Universities have conferred upon him their highest academic awards. His undaunted fortitude in leading an exemplary life as a Catholic layman has gained for him the highest accolade that his Church confers upon a lay apostle. Among his most treasured honors is his knighthood in the Order of St. Gregory and the Order of Malta.

Therefore, as a fitting recognition of all these attainments, Seattle University is proud to bestow upon Thomas E. Murray the seal of its sincerest approval—the degree of Doctor of Laws, *Honoris Causa*.
