CARLOS P. ROMULO

Ambassador to the United States Chief Delegate to the United Nations Philippines

Throughout history, in periods of crises, leaders among men have always arisen to meet the world's greatest problems.

Thus, it happened in the Philippines, in the gray dawn of the Twentieth Century, that Carlos P. Romulo began the march with his people to destiny—a destiny that culminated in his nation's independence.

Nurtured in a family steeped in the traditions of Christianity, the young patriot began the molding of his mind and heart for the difficulties which lay ahead. With increasing vigor and firmness of conviction, in press, radio, and personal lectures, he gave direction, vitality, and a growing sense of national dignity to a struggling young nation, which stands proudly today as the guardian of Christian culture in the East.

As a military leader during World War II, he fought, first, to protect and, later, to regain his native soil. His feats of valor in the battles of Bataan, of Corregidor, and of Manila have become legendary.

As head of the Philippine Delegation to the U. N. Conference in San Francisco, in 1945, he displayed a brilliant statesmanship which brought representation and recognition to the six hundred million dependent peoples of the world.

As president of the U. N. General Assembly in 1949, he stood symbolic of man's oneness—of East meeting West, and North meeting South, striving always to the end that freedom—not slavery, love—not hate, and peace—not war, should reign among the peoples of the earth.

In peace and war, he has ascended to the highest councils of man's trust, wherein he has provided unswerving guidance and service to his loyal people.

His personal qualities of courage, eloquence, superior intellectual ability, and intense love of God and country have ordained him to become one of the greatest champions of freedom in this age.

For these achievements and, preeminently, for his exemplary character as a Catholic gentleman, Seattle University is proud to confer on Carlos P. Romulo the seal of its highest award—the degree of Doctor of Laws—Honoris Causa.

Baccalaureate Honors

Based on the four-year scholastic record of the graduate, Baccalaureate Honors require the earning of at least 90 quarter hours as a Junior and Senior at Seattle University, the securing of at least the grade B in the comprehensive written examination in Philosophy and Theology, and the attainment of a high grade point average in the four-year curriculum of studies. A candidate who has made an average of 3.25 graduates Cum Laude; one who has made an average of 3.5, Magna Cum Laude; one who has made an average of 3.75, Summa Cum Laude. An A grade carries 4 grade points, a B 3 grade points, a C 2 grade points, a D 1 grade point, and an E no grade points.
