THE HONORABLE JEFFERSON CAFFERY

Dean, American Diplomatic Corps

"... the propitious smiles of heaven can never be expected on a nation that disregards the eternal rules of order and right, which heaven itself has ordained..."

In the 166 years that have followed President Washington's expression of the need for Divine Guidance in the affairs of government, few indeed of our fellow countrymen have devoted their lives and talents more unflinchingly and effectively to the observance of the "eternal rules of order and right" in international relations than has The Honorable Jefferson Caffery.

In a long and varied career, pursued in every major area of the world, he has focused the light of justice and equity on impending world crises, thereby enkindling the warmth of mutual understanding and cooperation among nations.

The period of his service witnessed America's ascendancy into the councils of world leadership and responsibility; during this time, he has observed both the tragedies befalling nations who disregard "the eternal rules of order and right," and the blessings bestowed on those whose policies are shaped according to the pattern of Eternal Wisdom.

From his first assignment to the diplomatic service in 1911, as Secretary of the American Legation in Caracas, Venezuela, to his most recent position as Ambassador to Egypt, he has presented to the capitals of the world American vision, courage, mercy, and integrity in arriving at solutions to the major problems of our time.

He has served as special presidential representative at many official functions in foreign states. In 1937, he was appointed Ambassador to Brazil, where he served with distinction. Following World War II, he was appointed Ambassador to France, at a time when America sought to assist in the reconstruction and rehabilitation of a war-torn Europe. While in this capacity, he represented the United States in the signing of peace treaties with Italy, Hungary, Romania, and Bulgaria, at Paris in 1947. The Lend-Lease Agreement, foreign-aid program, and many others of a technical, political, and economic nature bear his signature for posterity.

For these singular achievements which command the gratitude of all peoples, for his unselfish devotion to God and country, and, pre-eminently, for his exemplary character as a Catholic gentleman, Seattle University is pleased to add to the many distinctions already conferred on The Honorable Jefferson Caffery, its highest award, the degree of Doctor of Laws—*Honoris Causa*.

Baccalaureate Honors

Based on the four-year scholastic record of the graduate, Baccalaureate Honors require the earning of at least 90 quarter hours as a Junior and Senior at Seattle University, the securing of at least the grade B in the comprehensive written examination in Philosophy, and the attainment of a high grade point average in the four-year curriculum of studies. A candidate who has made an average of 3.25 graduates Cum Laude; one who has made an average of 3.5, Magna Cum Laude; one who has made an average of 3.75, Summa Cum Laude. An A grade carries 4 grade points, a B 3 grade points, a C 2 grade points, a D 1 grade point, and an E no grade points.
