Honorary Degree

WILLIAM MCPHERSON ALLEN

President, Boeing Airplane Company

Among those men who ascend to the highest positions in the world of business, many evidence marked talents for making difficult decisions; many others reveal outstanding capacities for organizing men into efficient production teams. However, it is rare indeed when these dual capacities are found in one individual. This unique distinction belongs to William M. Allen, President of Boeing Airplane Company.

Born and nurtured here in the West, and soon learning those important lessons of diligence and self-reliance, which have stood him in good stead ever since, Mr. Allen chose to undertake the responsibilities of the noble Profession of Law.

A year after graduation from Harvard Law School in 1925, Mr. Allen as a practicing lawyer received an assignment to work with a bustling aircraft company named Boeing, hailed as the biggest airplane plant in the United States. Looking back, this appointment had a mark of destiny about it, for twenty years later William Allen became president of Boeing Airplane Company, and thus assumed the challenge of leading his firm out of the general post-war recession that the whole airplane industry was then suffering.

It was at this time that Boeing's new president made his first crucial decision to build a new transport plane, the Stratocruiser. The real challenge, however, was to plan ahead to meet the age of jet-powered aircraft, which is aviation's future. Mr. Allen chose to be a part of that future, for under his leadership the company developed the B-47 Stratojet which became a central arm in the U. S. Air Force. This was followed by the famous intercontinental bomber, the B-52 Stratofortress, and its counterpart, the KC-97 Tanker Transport, which have become this country's leading air weapon. Not being satisfied with the development of jet-propelled military aircraft, Mr. Allen directed his engineers to design and develop a commercial jet transport. The result is the Model 707 Stratoliner which gives promise of revolutionizing air travel.

The Boeing Airplane Company is playing an historic role in this jet age of aviation. Under its new president, with his complete reliance and trust in his designers, his distinguished ability to organize men to a common purpose, and his willingness to make difficult and risky decisions, Boeing has creatively developed and experimented in advanced aircraft with such marked success, that today the Boeing Airplane Company has outgrown its national boundaries to become one of the leading aircraft manufacturers in the world.

For his distinguished ability to meet challenge and crisis in a striving and progressive business world, for his farsightedness and vision in advancing the frontiers of air power, for his singular contribution to and enduring faith in the Northwest, its people and community, Seattle University is honored to bestow on William McPherson Allen its highest award—the degree of Doctor of Laws, *Honoris Causa*.

Honorary Degree

THE MOST REVEREND THOMAS E. GILL, D.D.

With the rapid growth of the Pacific Northwest there has been a parallel development not only in the numbers but also in the complexity of the functions that are part of the Catholic Archdiocese of Seattle. Recognizing that growth and realizing that complexity His Holiness, Pope Pius XII, on April 11, 1956, appointed The Most Reverend Thomas E. Gill, D.D., as Auxiliary Bishop of Seattle, the first native son to be raised to this high ecclesiastical dignity.

His rise to the status of spiritual leadership in the Church is matched by proportional activity and prestige in civic life testifying to his outstanding personal ability to assume the trust of the sacred word of God while holding the trust of social responsibility.

Since his ordination to the holy priesthood in 1933, Bishop Gill has served as a curate at a number of parishes in the archdiocese and was made pastor of St. James Cathedral, Seattle, in February 1955, an office he still holds. He has also served for a number of years as spiritual director of the St. Vincent De Paul Society. He has been Archdiocesan Consultor since 1954. Among his other offices Bishop Gill is chaplain of the Assembly Club, member of the Board of the National Conference of Catholic Charities, member of the Washington State Council for Children and Youth, campaign vice-chairman of the Seattle-King County United Good Neighbor Fund and a member of the Seattle-King County Community Chest.

It is by virtue of his connection with Catholic Charities, however, that Bishop Gill is most distinguished. Having completed a Master's degree in the Graduate School of Social Service at Catholic University of America in 1938, he joined the staff of Catholic Charities in the fall of that year. In 1940 he became the Archdiocesan Director and he continues to hold and exercise that office. His dedication to the cause of unfortunate children has been an inspiration to all. None who have come in the path of Bishop Gill in his zealous pursuit of this cause have been free from his charming persuasion. From the children he sponsors to the highest officers of the state, his labors have won admiration and respect.

A rare blend of virtues mark him as a princely priest. He has boundless energies well modulated by a kindly gentleness. His executive abilities and judicial wisdom are tempered by a disarming and genuine humility, a quality manifest in the motto of his coat of arms, "*Secundum Verbum Tuum.*"

For these singular achievements, both in the Archdiocese and in the civic community, his unselfish service and pre-eminently for his exemplary priestly qualities, Seattle University is proud to confer upon His Excellency, The Most Reverend Thomas E. Gill, D.D., Titular Bishop of Lambaesis and Auxiliary Bishop of Seattle, the seal of its highest award—the degree of Doctor of Laws, *Honoris Causa*.

Honorary Degree

JAMES E. CASEY
President, United Parcel Service

That resourceful young men, no matter how humble their origins, may, through personal courage, vision and sacrifice, attain positions of leadership in our civic and economic life is a cherished American ideal. The history of this great country is replete with examples of such attainment, examples which have furnished inspiration for generations of young Americans. The story of James E. Casey and the United Parcel Service is in keeping with the best spirit of the tradition.

The eldest of four children in a family of moderate circumstances, James E. Casey was born in a small Nevada town a few years before the turn of the century. He was thrust into a position of responsibility early in life, when, shortly after the family had moved to Seattle, his father died. Young James, at the age of eleven, became the family breadwinner. Raised virtually in the shadow of Seattle University, he attended classes in religious instruction in what is now the University's Science building and came in contact for the first time with the Jesuit fathers who operate the University.

He soon gave signs of his resourcefulness, when, four years later, with two other young men and \$30 capital, he started his own messenger service. The business did not share in the Gold Rush boom of the time and young James spent the time between infrequent calls for service studying to improve himself. In 1907, he rented a small basement office in downtown Seattle and began what was to be the forerunner of the United Parcel Service of today.

It was at this time that young Mr. Casey conceived the idea of "consolidated delivery," the principle which became the foundation of his successful business. He recognized the basic inefficiency of the prevailing system in which each department store maintained its own delivery fleet and saw the advantage of one service for all stores. The idea was a good one. By 1918, the service was firmly established in Seattle. Expansion, first to California, then to Portland and next to New York City followed in order. Today, United Parcel Service is the largest consolidated delivery service in the world, with 10,000 employes in 16 of the country's leading metropolitan areas. Step by step, with impressive solidity, James E. Casey has built his company into a model of efficiency. -

James E. Casey's greatest accomplishment lies in the men that he has trained, chiefly by example, but also by precept and not a little urging. He has taught them that a friendly, selfless devotion to people is the most direct avenue to business success and that the by-products of personal satisfaction are of great value to everyone concerned. A man with a deep sense of responsibility and integrity, Mr. Casey sets as standards for his associates honesty in the fulfillment of agreements, pride in workmanship and incorruptible integrity. He has chosen his people well and they have supported him loyally through the years of growth. A humble and sincere person, he credits much of his company's success to the men in the organization. He has always adhered to the precept that the strength of an organization lies in the abilities of its members.

For his inspiring example of resourcefulness and economic leadership, for his insistence on high Christian standards in the conduct of his business, for his personal virtues of humility and devotion, Seattle University is proud to confer upon James E. Casey, the seal of its highest award—the degree of Doctor of Laws, *Honoris Causa*.

Baccalaureate Honors

Based on the four-year scholastic record of the graduate, Baccalaureate Honors require the earning of at least 90 quarter hours as a Junior and Senior at Seattle University, the securing of at least the grade B in the comprehensive written examination in Philosophy, and the attainment of a high grade point average in the four-year curriculum of studies. A candidate who has made an average of 3.25 graduates Cum Laude; one who has made an average of 3.5, Magna Cum Laude; one who has made an average of 3.75, Summa Cum Laude. An A grade carries 4 grade points, a B 3 grade points, a C 2 grade points, a D 1 grade point, and an E no grade points.
