Honorary Degree

LIEUTENANT GENERAL ARTHUR G. TRUDEAU

Chief of Research and Development, Department of the Army

The distinguished career of the gentleman whom we honor was built on a foundation of solid scholarship, spiritual devotion and well-rounded interests. At the United States Military Academy, Arthur Gilbert Trudeau was notable as a student, was vigorously Catholic in Catholic activities, and was a leader in the athletic life of West Point.

In 1924, he climaxed his academy career by graduating in the top five per cent of his class. In the opinion of his contemporaries, he was highly regarded as a cadet of unbounded energy, a true gentleman, and a real soldier.

General Trudeau's energy and capacity have been many times needed, and as frequently exercised, in these days of threat to the Republic. After graduating from West Point, in 1924, he earned a Master of Science Degree from the University of California. In the years that followed, General Trudeau was destined to serve his country in a variety of exacting and responsible commands. During the war years his leadership and competence were repeatedly called upon in the Southwest Pacific, in North Africa, and in the campaigns of the European continent.

In the tense and anxious interval that followed the war he was named Chief of the manpower control group in the War Department, General Staff. His outstanding talents were utilized in a variety of responsibilities which led, in October, 1956, to his being named Commanding General First Corps, U. S. Army Forces, Far East Command. In January, 1958, Lieutenant General Arthur Gilbert Trudeau was named to his present critical command, Chief of Research and Development for the United States Army.

For his achievements and outstanding service, General Trudeau has been repeatedly honored by our own government and decorated by the nations of the East and the West.

A distinguished soldier and gentleman, he has served his country with brilliance and devotion. His career shines with the rare qualities of outstanding competence, dynamic energy, personal honor and spiritual conviction. Americans are fortunate that the urgent responsibilities of research and development have been entrusted to his proven intelligence and vigilant care. We offer this outstanding citizen as an example for all our students to emulate in peace and war, in public and private life, in mind, character and spirit.

It is therefore with great pleasure that Seattle University bestows upon Arthur Gilbert Trudeau, Lieutenant General, U. S. Army, the Degree of Doctor of Laws, Honoris Causa.

Baccalaureate Honors

Based on the four-year scholastic record of the graduate, Baccalaureate Honors require the earning of at least 90 quarter hours as a Junior and Senior at Seattle University, the securing of at least the grade B in the comprehensive written examination in Philosophy, and the attainment of a high grade point average in the four-year curriculum of studies. A candidate who has made an average of 3.25 graduates Cum Laude; one who has made an average of 3.50, Magna Cum Laude; one who has made an average of 3.75, Summa Cum Laude. An A grade carries 4 grade points, a B 3 grade points, a C 2 grade points, a D 1 grade point, and an E no grade points.

Academic Costume

The caps, gowns, and hoods universally worn by faculties and candidates for degrees at graduating exercises is a costume dating back to the twelfth century. In medieval days the scholars were clerics; the buildings were cold, capes and hoods were required for warmth, and robes of scholars were similar to the cassocks of the clerics.

In the course of years of development, caps with tassels have replaced capes for the head covering, the hooded cape has been modified into the present hood, and the gowns with long flowing sleeves have been redesigned to indicate the character of the degree of the wearer. In 1893, a student movement in the United States endorsed academic apparel as overcoming awkwardness and difference in dress at graduation exercises and resulted in a standardization of academic costume in this country.

The Intercollegiate Code, adopted in 1895, recognizes three styles of gowns: a bachelor's gown, a master's gown, and doctor's gown. The differences in these gowns are mainly in the cut and shape of the sleeves and in the trimming. Hoods are also recognized for each of the above degrees and vary in shape, size, and length. The shell of the hood matches the black material of the gown, and is lined with the color or colors of the institution conferring the degree. The velvet bordering of the hood is of a color indicative of the field of learning to which the degree pertains. The Oxford cap, proper for all degrees, is worn both indoors and outdoors with academic costume. The tassel, worn over the left eye once the degree is conferred, is also symbolic of the degree and conforms to the code of colors for hood trimming. Prior to the actual conferring of the degree the tassel is worn over the right eye. Holders of Doctor's degrees are entitled to wear a gold tassel. The tassel of a bachelor's degree indicates the field in which the degree is granted. The color for each field of learning follows:
