MISS IRENE DUNNE

As a civilization may be measured by the status it recognizes and assigns to its women, the culture of the West has been elevated by its insistence that all women share equally in the essential worth of mankind. In the specifically Christian milieu, that worth, that dignity have attained still added honor and reverence; for as a woman is truly the mother of man, so as truly a woman is also the chosen Mother of God.

Seattle University, on this occasion, continues and renders emphatic a magnificent tradition of Christian culture. By the decision of its President and faculty it wishes formally to assert the merit of a gracious woman whose life and work are resplendent with talent, intelligence, character, and faith. Irene Dunne is an eminent actress, a devoted wife, a concerned and responsible citizen.

Currently and since 1957, Mrs. Irene Dunne Griffin has been an alternate delegate to the United Nations, an appointment made in recognition of her high qualifications by the President of the United States.

In addition, she is a member of the nation's Defense Advisory Committee and shares responsibility for welfare problems in the women's military forces. She has served as chairman of the National Women's Committee of the American Heart Association, as national vice-chairman of the annual Red Cross drive, and as honorary national commander of the Volunteer Army of the American Cancer Society. She has been cited by the National Conference of Christians and Jews for her significant assistance to religious unity.

The recipient of five Academy Award nominations for the best actress, Miss Dunne is one of the most highly respected of the film world's acknowledged leaders.

Upon Irene Dunne Griffin, honored by her profession, by universities, and by governments, Seattle University is today pleased to confer the degree of Doctor of Laws, *Honoris Causa*.

Baccalaureate Honors

Based on the four-year scholastic record of the graduate, Baccalaureate Honors require the earning of at least 90 quarter hours as a Junior and Senior at Seattle University, the securing of at least the grade B in the comprehensive written examination in Philosophy, and the attainment of a high grade point average in the four-year curriculum of studies. A candidate who has made an average of 3.25 graduates Cum Laude; one who has made an average of 3.5, Magna Cum Laude; one who has made an average of 3.75, Summa Cum Laude. An A grade carries 4 grade points, a B 3 grade points, a C 2 grade points, a D 1 grade point, and an E no grade points.

Academic Costume

The caps, gowns, and hoods universally worn by faculties and candidates for degrees at graduating exercises is a costume dating back to the twelfth century. In medieval days the scholars were clerics; the buildings were cold, capes and hoods were required for warmth, and robes of scholars were similar to the cassocks of the clerics.

In the course of years of development, caps with tassels have replaced capes for the head covering, the hooded cape has been modified into the present hood, and the gowns with long flowing sleeves have been redesigned to indicate the character of the degree of the wearer. In 1893, a student movement in the United States endorsed academic apparel as overcoming awkwardness and difference in dress at graduation exercises and resulted in a standardization of academic costume in this country.

The Intercollegiate Code, adopted in 1895, recognizes three styles of gowns: a bachelor's gown, a master's gown, and doctor's gown. The differences in these gowns are mainly in the cut and shape of the sleeves and in the trimming. Hoods are also recognized for each of the above degrees and vary in shape, size, and length. The shell of the hood matches the black material of the gown, and is lined with the color or colors of the institution conferring the degree. The velvet bordering of the hood is of a color indicative of the field of learning to which the degree pertains. The Oxford cap, proper for all degrees, is worn both indoors and outdoors with academic costume. The tassel, worn over the left eye once the degree is conferred, is also symbolic of the degree and conforms to the code of colors for hood trimming. Prior to the actual conferring of the degree the tassel is worn over the right eye. Holders of Doctor's degrees are entitled to wear a gold tassel. The tassel of a bachelor's degree indicates the field in which the degree is granted. The color for each field of learning follows:
